Pastor's Corner

"PREPARE"

"Prepare the way for the Lord: Matthew 3:3

hat are you doing for Christmas? It's a question that will be asked often in the coming weeks. What are you doing for Christmas? Are you traveling for the holidays? Are you having a special meal? Some special gifts in mind? What are you doing for Christmas?

If we heed the words of John the Baptist, what we should be doing for Christmas has nothing to do with buying gifts, special foods, or taking special trips. It has to do with faith. So with that in mind, here is what I am going to do in the weeks ahead to prepare for Christmas during Advent:

#1. I am going to worship. It seems to me that this is where we start. We go to worship. We do it on Sundays as we light the Advent candles. We do it for the mid-week Advent Services. If we are Matins people, we are there. We prepare first and foremost through worship

#2. I am also going to prepare by being in the Word, the Bible. Maybe I will read the story in Luke 2 about the birth of Jesus several times a week in several translations, each time looking for something just a little bit new. I will do daily devotions. I recommend the online ones. They are good for the faith and they cost nothing. Try "God Pause" from Luther Seminary or "Stillspeaking" from writers at the United Church of Christ.

#3. During Advent, I am also going to find ways to serve and give back. As a family, we are going to give some of the special gifts that are a part of the ELCA Good Gifts program. Gifts like bees, chickens, or pigs. Gifts that give life and sustain life. I am also going to volunteer to ring the bell for the Salvation Army as often as I can during the month of December. Find what works for you. But do something.

So, what are you doing for Christmas? Let me know.

Is your definition of a "normal family" a married mother and father and their biological children living together under one roof? If not, what do you think a "family" is – or can be? Do you think a new definition of family is starting to emerge in our society? If so, how do you see that in your own life or community? If not, why not? What experiences do you have with alternative family structures in general?

saw this topic in an issues of the New York Times from 2011. What is your definition of a "family?" Let's take a few minutes to think about it.

A long time ago, I had an opportunity to discuss this topic with my friends. My answer was not much different than the regular definition you would see in dictionary. Since then, I have been thinking about the question. I haven't come up with a clear definition yet. Here is a comment that I want to share from the question in the New York Times.

"A family is a group of people that will support you no matter what, will love you no matter what, and will be there for you through the good and bad times. They are the ones that will stick with each other and have each other's backs, even in tough circumstances. Family isn't determined by blood: it's about who stuck by you and never left you."

Solidarity, support, understanding...
Personally, I think these words represent the definition of family. After I lost my mom, I regretted that I didn't spend much time with her because I was busy – at least that was my excuse. I should have spent more time with my mom because she was very precious to me. Time waits for no one. Another regret is that I didn't support my mom with my all heart. I should have supported her no matter what, on any occasion. I thought I was supporting my mom when she was alive. But, I realized it was not enough. My love and support of my family needed to be with all my heart.

Solidarity... Why should we go to church? Why are we attending Woodlake? There are lots of good resources like the internet, radio, or television to watch good sermons and listen to fantastic music. But, it is hard to build relationships or fellowship only through media. The Bible tells us that we need to attend church to worship God with others and to grow spiritually through the Word. Regular gathering is a part of our lives as Christians, to build our relationship and fellowship.

"Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith bring brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur someone another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another- and all the more as you see the Day approaching." - Hebrews 10: 22- 25

We are the church that cares others as a family. This is the season of Advent. The season is coming for you, for me, and for everyone, to let us feel and share His love.
